Admissions

Minority status:

Admissions to the minority quota seats will be carried-out by the college. A specified percentage of seats out of the sanctioned intake in each branch is reserved by the competent authority for its minority quota seats. Admissions to the minority quota seats are offered by the college to the candidates from the state of Maharashtra belonging to the Jain Religious Gujarati Speaking Minority Community. Candidates belonging to this minority community are required to produce the Certificate regarding Domicile of Maharashtra from the appropriate authority.

Information about the admission for the minority quota seats to be allotted by the college would be displayed on the college notice boards and would also be advertised in the leading newspapers viz. Indian Express, Mumbai Samachar & Navshakti. Candidates applying for the seats against the minority quota, are required to produce the certificate in Form C given in Annexure-III. (To be issued by any of the approved organizations as listed at Annexure-IV). Candidates are also required to file an affidavit as per the Form A or B (as applicable) given in Annexure I / II.

Admissions to Undergraduate programs:

Eligibility Criteria:

Educational Qualification: The required qualification for admission to the first year of the four year degree courses in Engineering/Technology is as under:

1. Eligibility Criteria for Maharashtra State Candidate:

Candidate should be an Indian National and should have passed the HSC (Std. XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary education or its equivalent examination with subjects, English, Physics, Mathematics & Chemistry/ Biotechnology/ Biology/ Technical Vocational Subject.

AND

Secured minimum **50% marks**(Minimum **45% marks**, in case of Backward class categories and persons with Disability candidates belonging

Maharashtra State Only) in the subjects **Physics, Mathematics & Chemistry/ Biotechnology/Biology/Technical Vocational Subject** added together.

AND

Obtained a **positive Composite Score*** i.e., marks obtained after adding 50% of JEE(Main)2014 (Paper 1) marks and 50% of normalized Standard XII (Board or Equivalent Examination) marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

2. Diploma in Engineering/Technology Students

If any seats are remaining vacant after admitting all eligible candidates from H.S.C. stream, candidates who have passed the diploma course in Engineering/Technology with minimum of 50% marks, from the Polytechnics affiliated to MSBTE or AICTE approved autonomous Polytechnics in Maharashtra State will be admitted.

Note 1: Diploma holders with a minimum of 45% marks(40% marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories and physically Handicapped belonging only to M.S.) are eligible for direct admission to the second year of B.E. degree engineering courses.

Note 2: For students other than University of Mumbai.

Ordinance 111 of University of Mumbai pertaining to the eligibility criteria for admission is reproduced here: "No student from another university shall be admitted to any institution maintained or affiliated to the university except on production of a provisional statement of eligibility issued by the registrar, University of Mumbai."

Fee Structure:

The fee structure for all the Unaided Engineering colleges approved by the Shikshan Shulk Samiti (SSS) for the academic year 2013-14 is available on <http://www.sspnsamiti.gov.in>. The Shikshan Shulk Samitie has approved the interim tuition fee of Rs. 91,500/- for the academic year 2013-14. The students will, therefore, be required to give an undertaking that they agree to pay the amount of difference between the finally approved fee by SSS and actually paid fees. In case the final fee is less than that collected at the time of admission then the excess amount of fee will be refunded to the students within the duration of 4 weeks. Further, the candidates must note that we have been permitted to increase the tuition fee by 5% of the previous year's fees for every subsequent year. The details regarding fees etc., will be displayed on the college notice boards from time to time. Final decision of SSS will be binding on all the admitted candidates.

Along with the tuition fees and development fees, the candidates would be required to pay an additional fees as given below:

*First Year students would be charged Rs. 100/- extra for drawing sheets and folders.

+Stationery includes journal pages, files, computer sheets, index sheets and test papers.

Cancellation of admission and the refund of fees:

The Candidates who are provisionally admitted against Linguistic Minority quota/CAP seats may cancel the admission by submitting an application in the prescribed proforma which can be obtained on request from the Administrative Office and may request for refund of fees. The refund of fees will be considered only if the admission is taken provisionally by

- a)** paying the prescribed fees and by
- b)** submitting the original documents as mentioned in the admission brochure.

Refund of fees, as applicable, shall be made after deduction of the cancellation charges as prescribed by concerned authority for Unaided Minority Institutions.

Please note that refund of fees as per rules, shall be made within 15 days from the last date prescribed by the DTE for admission and the seats are completely filled.

Caution Money:

The Caution money collected from the students by the college will be retained till the student leaves the college. Students are, therefore, required to claim in writing for getting the refund of caution money deposit by fulfilling the following condition:

- (a)** They must raise their claim within 3 complete accounting years after the student actually leaves the college.

Or

- (b)** They must raise their claim within 3 complete accounting years of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier.

Note: If the caution money is not claimed during this period, it will be transferred to the student's Welfare Fund and will not be refunded, thereafter.

Check list for Certificates to be attached:

The applicant for Minority quota seat shall attach following certificates with his/her application for admission:

- a) Attested copy of Statement of marks obtained at S.S.C. examination or its equivalent.
- b) Attested copy of Statement of marks obtained at H.S.C. examination or its equivalent.
- c) Attested copy of Statement of marks of qualified through entrance list MAH-MBA/MMS-CET-2014.
- d) Attested copy of School/College leaving certificate of HSC (Std.XII).
- e) Attested copy of Provisional Statement of Eligibility issued by University of Mumbai, if Std. XI or XII examination is not passed from Maharashtra State Board.
- f) Certificate of the Indian Nationality of the candidate.
- g) For linguistic minority seats, affidavit on a stamped paper of Rs. 100/- in the prescribed format, Form A or Form B (as applicable), affirming that the candidate belongs to Jain Religious Gujarati Speaking Minority Community (linguistic minority).
- h) Original certificate from any of the registered community organizations listed in Annexure IV in format given as Form C given in Annexure III.
- i) Domicile Certificate of candidate indicating that he / she is domiciled in the state of Maharashtra by birth or permanent resident.
- j) Affidavit for Gap in education (if applicable).
- k) Attested copy of Proforma submitted at ARC (if applicable).

Guide-Lines and Instructions for the Applicants:

1. Original Certificates except (g) & (h) above should not be attached to the application. If attached, the college does not take responsibility if they are misplaced. Certificates (g) & (h) shall not be returned under any circumstances.

2. Attested copies of all the required certificates stated above must be submitted along with the application form. No certificate or any document will be accepted after the last date prescribed for the submission of the application.

3. After the grant of provisional admission, on the payment of the prescribed fees, the original certificates will be collected from the candidates and retained by the college for verification by D.T.E. for the confirmation of admission and the same will then be forwarded to the University of Mumbai for the purpose of enrolment.

The original documents will be returned, when they are received from University after the confirmation of enrolment. Candidates/parents are advised to keep sufficient no.of zerox copies of the certificates. Marksheets duly attested for the purpose of submitting to various other bodies viz. Bank loan, any trust for scholarship, etc.

4. Application form for admission will not be considered unless it is:

- a) Properly, Correctly and completely filled-in in legible hand-writing and
- b) Received in the office of the college on or before the last date prescribed for the that purpose.

5. An Agreement regarding observance of rules and timely payment of fees as prescribed by the Management will have to be signed at the time of admission by the candidate and his/her parent/legal guardian.

6. The admission granted to the candidate is provisional and is subject to the approval of the Directorate of Technical Education Maharashtra State, Pravesh Niyantaran Samiti and University of Mumbai.

7. On being offered the provisional admission, if the candidate does not pay the requisite fees immediately, he/she will not be considered for admission. No correspondence/queries will be entertained in this regard.

Admissions

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8. a) In case, the candidate has already taken the admission elsewhere and he/she is unable to produce original certificates (1) Statement of marks at qualifying examination and (2) School/College leaving certificate etc. at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured in some other institution, he/she shall produce a certificate from the Head of the Institution where he/she had already taken admission indicating that he/she had been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of those certificates duly attested by the Head of the Institution where originals are submitted.

b) The candidate who has submitted attested copies from Head of the Institution as per Rule 8 (a) shall also be required to pay the requisite fee immediately at the time of admission. They will have to submit original certificates within four working days from the date of admission. If they do not submit the originals, their admission will be cancelled and seat will be offered to next person in the merit list.

9. The Candidate/parents/the guardians should take note of all the matters relating to the admission such as eligibility, etc. Ignorance of the rules and regulations shall not be accepted as an excuse for any claim by the Candidate/parents/the guardians regarding admission, refund etc.

10. The college authorities, at their own discretion may refer any candidates to the appropriate Medical Authority for ascertaining the Physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. Based on the report of Medical Authority, further necessary action will be taken under intimation to the Regional Head of the Technical Education. It may be noted that Physically Handicapped candidates will not be provided with any additional facilities as far as academic activities pertaining to the courses are concerned. The college authorities reserve the right to have the antecedents of any candidate verified through the appropriate Police Authorities and take necessary action based on the report and the same will be intimated to the Regional Head of DTE

Admissions to Postgraduate Programs: Department of Management Studies

Eligibility Criteria:

Basic Qualification: In order to secure admission to first year of two year full time M.M.S. course, the candidate should fulfill the following eligibility criteria:

1. Candidate should have passed with minimum 50% marks in aggregate, any Bachelor's Degree of minimum 3 years' duration in any discipline, recognized by the Association of Indian Universities, and qualified through entrance list MAH-MBA/MMS-CET-2014.

OR

2. The candidate who has appeared** for the final year examination of any Bachelor's degree of minimum three years' duration in any discipline, recognized by the Association of Indian Universities. Such candidates can be considered for provisional admission subject to passing the Degree exam, with minimum of 50% marks in aggregate, and qualified through entrance list MAH-MBA/MMS-CET-2014.

OR

3. The candidate who has passed any Bachelor's degree course of minimum three years' duration in any discipline recognized by the Association of Indian Universities AND passed in any Post Graduate degree course of minimum two years duration recognized by the Association of Indian Universities in any discipline with minimum 50% marks in aggregate (45% in case of candidates of backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra State only), and qualified through entrance list MAH-MBA/MMS-CET-2014.

2. Eligibility Criteria for admission to Maharashtra State candidates through CAP:

1. Candidate should be an Indian National and should possess basic qualification as specified in rule no.1
2. Appeared for MAH-MBA/MMS-CET 2014.

3. Eligibility Criteria for admission against All India Seats through CAP:

1. Candidates should be an Indian National and should Possess basic qualification as specified in rule no.1
2. Appeared for CAT(conducted by IIMs)/GMAT(conducted by GMAC, USA)/CMAT 2014(conducted by AICTE)/MAT(conducted by AIMA in February 2014)/XAT(conducted by XLRI)/ATMA(conducted by AIMS)/MAH-MBA/MMS-CET 2014.

Note: Candidates are advised to ensure before applying for the admission to the MMS Programme that he/she is eligible for admission to the programme as per the relevant Eligibility Rules of the University, before applying for admission to the MMS programme.

Generally candidates passing qualifying degree examination by part time or by correspondence course or passing in more than one sitting are not considered eligible by several Universities.

A: Eligibility Criteria for admission for candidates from Maharashtra State (Type A – B)

1. Candidate should be an Indian National and should possess qualification as specified and qualified Through MBA/MMS-CET-14.

4: Eligibility Criteria for admission against Minority Seats :

1. Candidate should be an Indian National and should possess basic qualification as specified in rule No.1
2. In case of Minority seats, the candidate should belong to the Minority community/group for which the institute has secured minority status and appeared for the Common Entrance Test (and qualified Through MBA/MMS-CET-14), conducted by the competent Authority of Maharashtra State for the academic year 2014-15.

Note:

1. Candidates seeking admission against the Minority Seats in Minority Institutes will have to fulfill the additional eligibility criterion as specified in the Government Resolution(Ref: G.R. No. ASS-2006/634/P.K.63/2006/35 dated 11.6.2006; this GR is available on their website) and its amendments which may be published from time to time.

Candidates appeared for final year examination fulfilling the remainin eligibility criteria will be offered provisional admission subject to the condition that they will pass the examination with the required percentage of marks on or before the cut-off date.

In case, the candidate fails to produce the results of the final year examination on or before the cut-off date, then admission offered to such a candidate will be automatically cancelled and the fees (tuition, development and other fees) paid by the candidate for the academic year 2014-15 will be forfeited.

Note: There shall be no reservation for Backward Class Category Candidates in Unaided Minority Institutes.

Admission Procedure:

Admission to the MMS course will be on the basis of the overall merit in qualified through entrance list MAH-MBA/MMS-CET-2014. examination, conducted by the Director of Technical Education, MS and as per the applicable rules of the government.

Check list for Certificates to be attached:

1. The applicant shall attach the following certificates with his/her application for admission:

a) Attested copies of statement of marks obtained at SSC and HSC examinations.

b) Attested copy of statement of marks for the Bachelor's Degree examination. (i.e., the qualifying Degree examination)

c) Attested copy of Statement of marks of qualified through entrance list MAH-MBA/MMS-CET-2014..

d) Domicile of Maharashtra State Certificate, indicating the place of permanent residence of the candidate / father or mother or husband.

e) Certificate of Indian Nationality in the name of the candidate.

f) For minority candidates, affidavit IN ORIGINAL on a Non-judicial stamp paper of Rs.100/- in the prescribed format Form A/B (given at Annexure I/II) made by candidate or his parent /guardian, as applicable, affirming that the candidate belongs to Jain Religious and Gujarati speaking Minority Community.

g) For Minority candidates, ORIGINAL CERTIFICATE from the approved community organization in prescribed format Form C (Annexure III) from any one of the approved organizations listed at Annexure IV in the prospectus.

h) Attested copy of Transfer Certificate if applicable

i) Affidavit for Gap in Education, if any.

2. Original Certificates except (f & g) above should not be attached to the application. If attached, the college does not take responsibility if they are misplaced.
3. Attested copies of all the required certificates stated above must be submitted along with the Application form.
4. All requisite certificates once submitted alongwith the application form will not be returned to the candidate (including f & g as mentioned above in a (1)) under any circumstances.
5. Neither any certificate, nor any other document will be accepted after the prescribed last date of submission of the Application.
6. After grant of provisional admission, on receipt of prescribed fees, the original certificates will be collected from the candidates and retained by the College for verification by DTE for confirmation of admission. The same will then be forwarded to the University of Mumbai for enrolment. The originals will be returned, when they are received from University after the confirmation of enrolment.

In case of Minority seats, the candidate should belong to the Jain Religious and Gujarati speaking Minority Community and further the candidate should submit a certificate issued by a registered Community trust to which he/she belongs. The format for the same is as given in annexure.

The candidates are further advised to refer to the eligibility criteria incorporated in the brochure issued by the Director of Technical Education. The criteria given above are based on previous years' criteria. Final rules applicable will be as directed by the Director of Technical Education, M.S. for the academic year 2014-15.

Fee Structure:

Candidate who have secured admission for the first year of MMS are required to pay the fees at the respective Unaided Minority Institutes as approved by the Shikshan Shulka Samiti, Bandra (East), Mumbai.

a) At the time of admission, the finally approved fees by Shikshan Shulk Samiti for year 2013-14 plus 5% will be collected from the candidate as an interim fee. For 2013-14 Rs.1,56,170/- was collected as tuition and development fee from each candidate. Difference if any between the actually collected fees and finally approved by Shikshan Shulk Samiti for 2014-15 will be required to pay by the candidate within reasonable time. If the collected fee at the time of admission is more than approved by Shikshan Shulk Samiti, the same excess amount will be refunded by the college within 4 weeks. Additional fees will be as approved by University of Mumbai, DTE, Shikshan Shulk Samiti, or any authority appointed by Government of Maharashtra

Other fees:

University share of Tuition fee, Examination fee, charges for Industrial Visit etc. will be collected separately. During academic year 2013-14 University share of tuition fee was Rs.12000/- per student.

b) Refund of Tuition, Development and Other fees after cancellation of admission secured through CAP rounds, Institute level round(s) and vacancy round(s) of admissions: (Reference: AICTE Guidelines No. AICTE/Legal/04(01)/2007 & Circular No.698 dated 24th August, 2007 issued by Pravesh Niyantaran Samiti, Mumbai.)

Cancellation Of Admission

The candidate who has been provisionally admitted may cancel admission by submitting an application in duplicate, and may request for refund of fees. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made in due course. It is made clear that such application for cancellation will be considered if and only if the admission is confirmed by paying the prescribed tuition fee and other fees in full and by submitting the original documents. Refund shall be made after deduction of the cancellation charges as shown below:

c) The Caution Money Deposit collected by the college will be retained till the student leaves the college. Student should claim refund of caution money in writing at the earliest but

(i) within 2 complete accounting years after the student actually leaves the college or

(ii) within 2 complete accounting years of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier.

If not claimed during this period, the caution money deposit will be transferred to the Students' Welfare Fund and will not be refunded.

Fees concession / reimbursement:

The concession (if any) in the tuition and development fees may be offered to following candidates.

*Maharashtra State candidates belonging to economically weaker sections Candidates belonging to Economically Weaker section will be required to submit the Income certificate from competent authority for claiming fee reimbursement. However, the directives issued by the State Government from time to time with regard to requirement of additional certificates and mode of fees reimbursement shall be binding on such candidates.

Note:

a) The extent of fees concession, nature of fees concession (loan/scholarship), requirements of certificates etc. will be decided by the State Government and same shall be binding on the candidate.

b) The details of the fees concession (if any) will be made available to aspiring candidates at the time of filling of Option Form for CAP Round-I.

c) Entire amount of Security/Caution Money Deposit is to be refunded to candidate.

#For calculation of amount on the pro-rata basis, one month shall be treated as one unit e.g. if the candidate cancels admission on third day after start of academic session & the seat is filled before the cutoff date, then cancellation charges will be the higher amount of $(\text{total fees})/12$ or Rs. 1000/-.

Age limit:

There is no age limit for admission to first year of two year post graduate course of MMS.

Miscellaneous:

There shall be no transfer of students at any stage from Govt./Govt. aided / University/ Department/University managed/ Unaided Institute/ Unaided Minority Institute to any other Institute in Maharashtra and no transfer of students from any Institute located outside Maharashtra to any institute in Maharashtra. The candidates are informed that the medium of instruction, for the MMS programme is English.

At the time of seeking admissions, a candidate will be provisionally admitted to MMS programme at this college subject to the production of the Provisional eligibility certificate from University of Mumbai.

Each of the candidates is advised to ensure before applying for admission to the MMS programme, that he/she is eligible for admission to the programme as per the relevant Eligibility Rules of the University.

Generally candidates passing qualifying degree examination by part time/ correspondence course, or not passed in one sitting are not considered eligible by several Universities.

If the candidate is not in a position to hand over the undertaking at the time of verification of documents that he/she will submit the same before due date fixed for the same.

Admission Procedure:

1. Application for admission will not be considered unless it is –
 - a) Properly, correctly and completely filled in and is fully legible
 - b) Accompanied by the attested copies and original certificates for Minority of the requisite certificates in support of the claims made in the application.
 - c) Received in the office of the college on or before the last date prescribed for the same.
2. An agreement regarding observance of rules and timely payment of fees as prescribed by the Management will have to be signed at the time of admission, by the candidate and his/her parent/legal guardian.
3. The admission granted to the candidate is provisional and is subject to the approval of the Directorate of Technical Education, M.S., Pravesh Niyantaran Samiti and University of Mumbai.
4. The candidates will be considered for provisional admission as mentioned above. On being offered the provisional admission, if the candidate does not pay the requisite fees immediately, he/she will not be considered for admission. No correspondence/queries etc. will be entertained in the matter.
5. A) In case admission is already taken elsewhere:
If a candidate is unable to produce original certificates of (1) statement of marks at qualifying examination and (2) School/ College leaving certificate, etc. at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already taken elsewhere, he/she shall produce a certificate from the Head of the Institution where he/she had already taken admission indicating that he/she had been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of these certificates duly attested by the Head of the Institution where originals are submitted.

B) The candidate who has submitted attested copies from Head of the Institution as per Rule 5 (A) shall also be required to pay the requisite fee immediately at the time of admission. They will have to submit original certificates within four working days from the date of admission, if they do not submit the originals, their admission will be cancelled and seat will be offered to next person in merit list.

6. The students/ their guardians should take note of all the matters relating to admission such as eligibility, etc. Ignorance of the rules and regulations shall not be accepted as an excuse for any claim by the students/ their guardians, regarding admission, refund, etc.

7. The College authorities, at their own discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate Medical Authority for ascertaining the Physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. Based on the report of Medical Authority, further necessary action will be taken under intimation to the Regional Head of the Technical Education. It may be noted that Physically Handicapped candidates will not be provided with any additional facilities as far as academic activities pertaining to the courses are concerned.

The College authorities reserve their right to have the antecedents of any candidates verified through the appropriate Police Authorities and take necessary action based on the report under intimation to Regional Head of the Technical Education.

Conduct and Discipline

If any student studying in any MBA/MMS/PGDBM college / Institute in the State is found indulging in antinational activities, or in activities that run contrary to the letter and spirit of the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by the Government, or any activity that causes his/her behavior to be contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the College / Institute forthwith without any notice by the Principal of the College

If any of the statements made in application form or any information supplied by the candidate in connection with his / her admission is, at any time, found to be false or incorrect and willful suppression of facts, his / her admission will be cancelled forthwith. The fees will be forfeited and he / she may be expelled from the college / Institution by the Principal / The Director and prosecuted, if deemed necessary. Any appeal against the order of cancellation of admission / expulsion, however, may be referred to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final and binding on all concerned.

General Rules and Regulations:

- 1.** All the students are expected to be regular and punctual in attendance. The main gate shall be closed at a specified time. If any student insists on gate to be opened at odd hours and enters into arguments for the same with the Watchman, disciplinary action will be taken against such student.
- 2. Students must carry smart card and I-card with them all the time.** In case, it is lost, the concerned student should contact the administrative office immediately and apply for the duplicate I-card.

Conduct and Discipline

- 3.** Students must read the notices/instructions on the notice board regularly. Notices for scheduled date of payment of tuition fees, examination fees, etc. will be displayed on the notice board from time to time. Late fee will be levied after the due date. After certain period, as per University directive, examination fees are not accepted and candidate is not permitted to appear for the concerned examination. Anybody, remaining absent, should keep in touch with his/her classmates and keep themselves informed about the notices displayed. Ignorance of any notice even in case of absenteeism shall not be considered as an excuse.
- 4.** During working hours, all the students are required to be in their respective classrooms or laboratory.
- 5.** Smoking and consumption of alcoholic drinks are strictly prohibited. Persons found to be drunk will be asked to quit the college.
- 6.** Political activities and other activities prohibited by the Government, shall not be permitted within the college premises.
- 7.** Teasing/harassment of fellow students is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students involved in such activity. Ragging is banned under law. Anybody violating the law will be handed over to the Police.
- 8.** Dress code* shall be strictly followed by all the students.
- 9.** Electronic devices, (other than watches and non-programmable calculators) like Cell Phones, Walkman etc. are prohibited in the College Campus. If such devices are brought in the campus, the same will be confiscated.

Conduct and Discipline

10. Students shall not indulge in activities, which would damage / disfigure Institute's property including books, apparatus, furniture etc.

11. Students shall take utmost care to maintain general decorum and silence in the college premises even during free time. Appropriate action will be taken against anybody found loitering or disturbing other classes, which are in progress. In case they have reached late due to unavoidable circumstances, they should enter the classroom with the permission of the teacher in the class and without disturbing the class, should sit down on benches, which are reserved for latecomers.

12. Students will be permitted to interact with the administrative office for any type of work including payment of fees etc. only during scheduled time displayed at the counters/outside the office.

13. Students shall take prior permission for remaining absent, even if they have a genuine reason. Disciplinary action will be taken against any student remaining absent for more than 3 (three) continuous working days without permission. In case of sickness or such unexpected reason, the student should immediately send a note intimating reason for having remained absent, preferably with a certificate from concerned doctor/intimation from parent/guardian.

14. Students shall not leave the classroom/laboratory during lecture period/practical without permission of the concerned faculty.

15. Students are allowed to use library, common room, gymkhana and canteen during scheduled time and only in free time and not during lectures/practicals.

Conduct and Discipline

16. Cent percent (100%) attendance in lectures/practicals/tutorials is compulsory. Those remaining absent with prior permission for genuine reasons should also have atleast 75% attendance in each subject. Otherwise, as per University rules their term will not be granted and he / she will not be permitted to appear in semester end examination. Any excuses will not be accepted at the end of the term, if the attendance is short.

17. For granting term, students are required to submit the journals/assignments on time and appear in compulsory periodic tests.

18. Use of unfair means during examination will be punishable as per University of Mumbai rules.

19. In addition to the above, students shall follow rules and procedures specified for examination, use of library, laboratory, canteen and gymkhana. Relevant rules and regulations are available at respective centers or displayed from time to time.

***Dress Code**

Normally, students are supposed to wear following types of dresses:

Boys: Pants/formal jeans, Shirt/T-Shirt with sleeves, (shorts are not allowed) Blazers.

Girls: Saree (blouse with sleeves), Salwar-Kameez with sleeves, Trousers/full formal jeans (no tights, hipsters or low waist), Shirts/T-Shirts with sleeves, (should not be body hugging) Blazers.

Sleeveless dresses to be avoided.

Conduct and Discipline

Prevention of Ragging in Institutions:

Ragging in any form in the college is prohibited and strict action according to rules would be taken against those candidates who indulge in it.

"Ragging is prohibited as per the decision of the Supreme Court of India in Writ Petition No. (c) 656 / 1998."

General:

1. Specific dress code for sensitive areas or laboratories shall be applicable.
2. In specific cases, dresses other than the above may be permitted.
3. Slippers are not permitted.
4. Boys (other than Sikhs) to have normal hair cut (long hairs and odd looking hair cut will not be permitted). Sikh students shall wear turbans.
5. Girls shall keep hair properly tied/buckled and should be well dressed.

Important Note:

If anyone is found in attire which violates the decorum and / or is found to be objectionable, appropriate disciplinary action shall be taken by the college authorities.
