II Establishment and Management

• Mahavir Education Trust, established for the purpose of imparting technical education, started the Engineering College in July 1984 with the help of munificent donations from the two main donors viz.

1. Shri. Lalji Velji Anchorwala
2. Smt. Shah Laxmiben Karamshi Bhujpurwala Charitable Trust

Both the donors belong to the Kutchhi Community and as per their wish; the Engineering College is named as Shah & Anchor Kutchhi Engineering College.

- The funds for the development of the Engineering College are augmented from time to time by donations received by the Trust from philanthropic businessmen and industrialists.
- **The College is approved by A.I.C.T.E. The process for reaccreditation of Electronics Engineering Course and accreditation of Computer Engineering and Information Technology Courses is under progress. The College is recognized by the Directorate of Technical Education, M.S. and is affiliated to the University of Mumbai. The college is also ISO 9001:2008 certified by RINA.**
- Before starting the Engineering College, the Mahavir Education Trust had established

Shah & Anchor Kutchhi Polytechnic at Chembur. The Polytechnic was inaugurated on August 27, 1983 by Late Shri Vasantdada Patil, the then Honorable Chief Minister of the Maharashtra State. The Polytechnic is recognized by the **Directorate of Technical Education M.S.** It conducts courses leading to the Diploma in Electronics Engineering, Computer Technology, Electronics and Telecommunication and Information Technology awarded by the Board of Technical Education, M.S. The Polytechnic is also awarded accreditation by National Board of Accreditation for its two courses viz.

(1) Electronics and Telecommunication

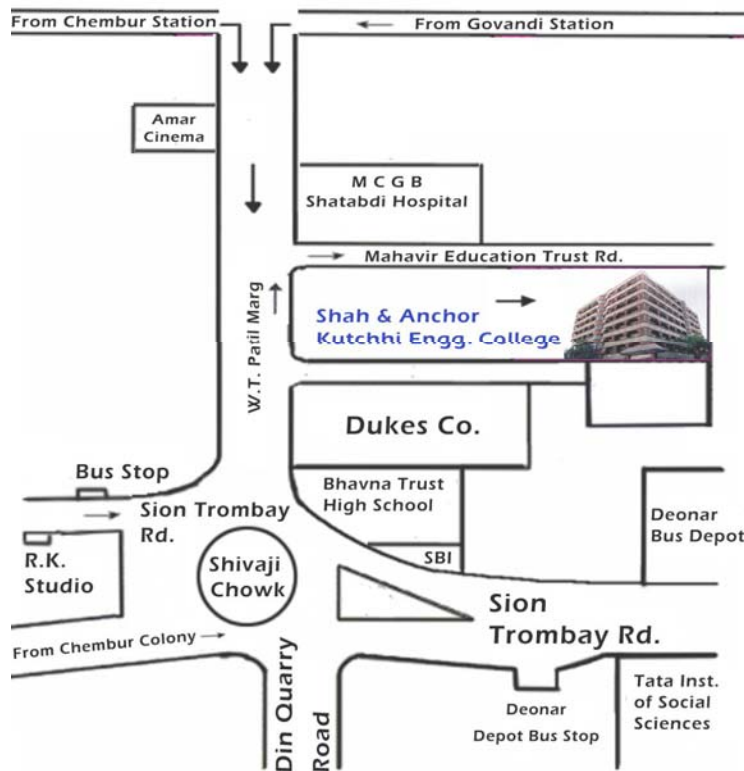
(2) Computer Technology.

- The Engineering College and the Polytechnic are given the status of minority institutions by the Government of Maharashtra since the academic year 2002-2003.

III Location, Infrastructure and Environment :

- The college is located between Mahavir Education Trust Chowk and Duke's company on Waman Tukaram Patil Marg and is within walking distance from Govandi station, on the CST-Vashi/Panvel Suburban Harbour Line of Central Railway. A number of BEST Bus routes, connecting the college are available from Borivali, Goregaon, Andheri, Bandra, Dadar, Kurla, Navi Mumbai, etc. (Refer map given below)
- The college building is of 1,55,000sq. ft. built- up area that accommodates spacious classrooms, laboratories, an administrative block, a library with a reading hall, a Drawing Hall, a conference and seminar hall, computer laboratories, etc.

V Linguistic Minority Quota:

A specified percentage of seats of the sanctioned intake in each branch is reserved by the competent authority. Admissions to the minority quota seats are offered by the college to the candidates, from the state of Maharashtra belonging to the Jain Religious Gujarati speaking minority community. Candidates are required produce Domicile of Maharashtra Certificate from appropriate authority. Information about the admission for the minority quota seats to be given by the college would be displayed on the college notice boards and would also be advertised in leading newspapers viz. Indian Express and Mumbai Samachar. No separate intimation would be given to individual candidates. Candidate applying against the minority quota seat is required to produce a certificate in Form C given in Annexure-III. (To be issued by one of the approved organizations as per the draft listed at Annexure-IV). Candidates are also required to file an affidavit as per the draft given in Form A or B (as applicable) given in Annexure I/II.

VI Eligibility Criteria for Admission:

Educational Qualification: The required qualification for admission to the first year of the four year degree course in Engineering/Technology is as under:

1. For HSC Students from Maharashtra:

Candidate should be an Indian national and should have passed SSC (Std. X) and HSC (Std. XII) examinations from Maharashtra State Boards. He/she is required to pass Higher Secondary Examination or its equivalent examination with English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics; and is also required to obtain minimum of 50% marks in the **PCM**(Physics, Chemistry & Mathematics) group.

And

The admission will be given based on Merit List prepared with MHT-CET 2010 score.

The candidates are further advised to refer to the eligibility criteria incorporated in the brochure issued by the Directorate of Technical Education, M.S.

2. Diploma in Engineering/Technology Students

If any seats are remaining vacant after admitting all eligible candidates from H.S.C. stream, candidates who have passed the diploma course in Engineering/Technology with minimum of 50% marks, from the Polytechnics affiliated to MSBTE or AICTE approved autonomous Polytechnics in Maharashtra State will be admitted.

Note 1: Diploma holders with a minimum of 60% marks are eligible for direct admission to second year of B.E. degree engineering course.

Note 2: For students other than University of Mumbai.

Ordinance 111 of University of Mumbai pertaining to the eligibility criteria for admission is reproduced here: “No student from another university shall be admitted to any institution maintained or affiliated to the university except on production of a provisional statement of eligibility issued by the registrar.”

VII Fees:

1. The Fee Structure:

The fee structure for Unaided Engineering colleges approved by the Shikshan Shulk Samiti (SSS) for the academic year 2009-10 is available on <http://www.sspnsamiti.gov.in>. The SSS approved tuition fees for academic year 2009-10 was Rs60,850/ As intimated by SSS vide circular SSS (H&T) dated 5th June, 2009 our interim tuition fee for 2010-11 will be 10%(or whatever percentage SSS recommends) more than the approved fee for the year 2009-10. However, the students are required to give an undertaking that they will pay the difference between the finally approved fee by SSS and actually paid fee, if final fee is more than that collected at the time of admission. If it will be less, the college will refund the excess amount collected, within 4 weeks time. Further, candidates must note that the tuition fee will be increased by 10% of the previous year’s fees for every subsequent year. Further details regarding fees etc. will be displayed on the college notice boards.

Final decision of SSS will be binding on all the admitted students.

Along with tuition fees and development fees, the candidate would be charged additional fees for the facilities as given below:

* First Year students would be charged Rs. 100 extra for drawing sheets and folders.

+Stationery includes journal pages, files, computer sheets, index sheets and test papers.

2. Refund of Fees:

The Candidate who are provisionally admitted against Linguistic Minority quota/CAP seats may cancel admission by submitting an application in the prescribed proforma which can be obtained on request from the Administrative Office and may request for refund of fees. The refund of fees will be considered only if the admission is taken provisionally by a) paying the prescribed fees and by b) submitting the original documents as mentioned in the admission form. Refund of fees, as applicable, shall be made after deduction of the cancellation charges as prescribed by concerned authorities for Unaided Minority Institutions.

3. Caution Money:

The Caution money collected by the college will be retained till the student leaves the college. Student should claim refund of caution money in writing by fulfilling the following condition:

(a) Within 3 complete accounting years after the student actually leaves the college

Or

(b) Within 3 complete accounting years of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier.

Note: If not claimed during this period, the caution money will be transferred to the Student's Welfare Fund and will not be refunded.

VIII Check list for Certificates to be attached:

The applicant for Minority quota seat shall attach following certificates with his/her application for admission:

- a) Attested copy of Statement of marks obtained at S.S.C. examination or its equivalent.
- b) Attested copy of Statement of marks obtained at H.S.C. examination or its equivalent.
- c) Attested copy of Statement of marks of MHT-CET 2010/AIEEE.
- d) Attested copy of School/College leaving certificate of HSC (Std.XII).
- e) Attested copy of Provisional Statement of Eligibility issued by University of Mumbai, if Std. XI or XII examination is not passed from Maharashtra State Board.
- f) Certificate of the Indian Nationality of the candidate.
- g) **For linguistic minority seats, affidavit on a stamped paper of Rs. 50/- in the prescribed format, Form A or Form B (as applicable), affirming that the candidate belongs to Jain Religious Gujarathi speaking minority community (linguistic minority).**
- h) **Original certificate from any one of the registered community organization listed in Annexure IV in Form C given in annexure III .**
- i) Domicile Certificate of candidate indicating that he/she is domiciled in the state of Maharashtra by birth or permanent resident.
- j) Affidavit for Gap in education.
- k) Proforma-I on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs 100/ only.

IX Guide Lines and Instructions for Applicants:

1. Original Certificates except (g)& (h) above should not be attached to the application. If attached, the college does not take responsibility if they are misplaced. Certificates (g)& (h) shall not be returned under any circumstances.

2. Attested copies of all the required certificates stated above must be submitted along with the application form. No certificate or any document will be accepted after the prescribed last date of submission of the application.

3. After grant of provisional admission, on receipt of prescribed fees, the original certificates will be collected from the candidates and retained by the college for verification by D.T.E. for the confirmation of admission. The same will then be forwarded to the University of Mumbai for enrolment. The originals will be returned, when they are received from University after the confirmation of enrolment.

4. Application for admission will not be considered unless it is:

- a) Properly, Correctly and completely filled-in in legible hand-writing.
- b) Received in the office of the college on or before the last date prescribed for the same.

5. An agreement regarding observance of rules and timely payment of fees as prescribed by the Management will have to be signed at the time of admission, by the candidate and his/her parent/legal guardian.

6. The admission granted to the candidate is provisional and is subject to the approval of the Directorate of Technical Education, Maharashtra State Pravesh Niyantaran Samiti and University of Mumbai.

7. On being offered the provisional admission, if the candidate does not pay the requisite fees immediately, he/she will not be considered for admission.

No correspondence/queries etc. will be entertained in the matter.

8. a) In case admission is already taken elsewhere: If a candidate is unable to produce original certificates of (1) Statement of marks at qualifying examination and (2) School/College leaving certificate etc. at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured in some other institution, he/she shall produce a certificate from the Head of the Institution where he/she had already taken admission indicating that he/she had been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of those certificates duly attested by the Head of the Institution where originals are submitted.

b) The candidate who has submitted attested copies from Head of the Institution as per Rule 8 (a) shall also be required to pay the requisite fee immediately at the time of admission. They will have to submit original certificates within four working days from the date of admission. If they do not submit the originals, their admission will be cancelled and seat will be offered to next person in the merit list.

9. The Candidate/parents/the guardians should take note of all the matters relating to admission such as eligibility, etc. Ignorance of the rules and regulations shall not be accepted as an excuse for any claim by the Candidate/parents/the guardians regarding admission, refund etc.

10. The college authorities, at their own discretion may refer any candidates to the appropriate Medical Authority for ascertaining the Physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. Based on the report of Medical Authority, further necessary action will be taken under intimation to the Regional Head of the Technical Education. It may be noted that Physically Handicapped candidates will not be provided with any additional facilities as far as academic activities pertaining to the courses are concerned. The college authorities reserve the right to have the antecedents of any candidate verified through the appropriate Police Authorities and take necessary action based on the report and the same will be intimated to Regional Head of the Technical Education.

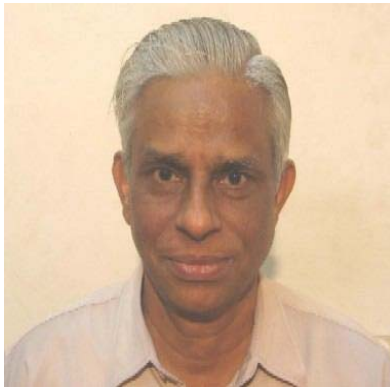

XIII Infrastructure and Facilities:

A) Classrooms:

XV Co-Curricular Activities:

The College has Student Chapters of three professional societies viz. Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), Indian Society for Technical Education (ISTE) and Computer Society of India (CSI), which are aimed at honing the technical skills of the students. They provide the students the opportunity to acquire Multi-dimensional skills and develop good inter-personal relationships. They organize seminars, workshops and technical events based on the recent technological advances in the field of engineering. Inter-collegiate competitions are also organized to develop the spirit of camaraderie and personality traits.

XVI Sports and Cultural Activities:

The College emphasizes on the overall development of the student's personality through participation in various sports and cultural activities along with the routine academic curricula. Our students participate in various inter-collegiate events and have won several accolades for the institution. Every year the college organizes the intra-collegiate cultural event **VERVE** and intra-collegiate sporting event **OLYMPUS** to give ample opportunities to students to demonstrate their extracurricular skills.

XVII Industrial Visits:

Industrial visits to top companies in and outside Mumbai are arranged every year to give the students the real feel and unique experience of industrial working environment. It helps to provide the student to get an insight into the current technological advancements and gives them an opportunity to directly interact with the technocrats and thus help them to think beyond classroom education.

XVIII Placement Activities:

The placement council of the college consists of a senior placement officer supported by a team of placement coordinators. Beginning with the technical interaction and coordination with prime industries, the team arranges on-campus interviews for the recruitment of our students to reputed companies. Training of students for placement interviews is an integral part of the placement activity. Most of the eligible candidates get placed in blue chip companies before their graduation. The annual salaries offered to our students are around Rs.2.4 lakh, with a maximum of over Rs.4 lakh.

XXI Shah Dhirajlal Budhichand Trust Scholarship:

Thanks to Shri Girish D. Shah, who has been kind enough to donate Rs.1, 00,000/- (Rs One Lakh) every year from Shah Dhirajlal Budhichand Trust. Since the academic year 2005-06 ten Scholarships each of Rs.10,000/- are given to the needy students of the college. A selection committee consisting of representatives of the donor trust board and the teaching staff along with the Principal selects the candidates from deserving applicants.

XXII General Rules and Regulations:

- 1.** All the students are expected to be regular and punctual in attendance. The main gate shall be closed at a specified time. If any student insists on gate to be opened at odd hours and enters in arguments for the same with the watchman, disciplinary action will be taken against him/her.
- 2. Students shall carry smart card and I-card with them all the time.** In case, it is lost, concerned student is obliged to contact administrative office immediately and apply for the duplicate card.
- 3. Students are required to read the notices/instructions on the notice board regularly.**

Notices for scheduled date of payment of tuition fees, examination fee, etc. will be displayed on the notice board from time to time. Late fee will be levied after due date. After certain period, as per University directive, examination fees are not accepted and candidate is not permitted to appear for the concerned examination. Anybody, remaining absent, should keep in touch with his/her classmates and keep themselves informed about the notices displayed. Ignorance of any notice even in case of absenteeism shall not be considered as an excuse.
- 4.** During working hours, all the students are required to be in their respective classrooms or laboratory.
- 5.** Smoking and consumption of alcoholic drinks are strictly prohibited. Persons found to be drunk will be asked to quit the college .
- 6.** Political activities and any activity prohibited by the Government shall not be permitted within the college premises.
- 7.** Teasing/harassment of fellow students is strictly prohibited in the College Campus. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students involved in such activity. Ragging is banned under the law. Anybody violating the law will be handed over to the Police.
- 8.** Dress code* shall be strictly followed by all the students.
- 9.** Electronic devices (other than watches and non-programmable calculators) like Cell Phones, Walkman etc. are prohibited in the College Campus. If such devices are brought in the campus, the same will be confiscated.
- 10.** Students shall not indulge in activities, which would damage/disfigure Institute's property including books, apparatus, furniture etc.
- 11.** Students shall take utmost care to maintain general decorum and silence in the college premises even during free time. Appropriate action will be taken against anybody found loitering or disturbing other classes, which are in progress. In case they have reached late due to unavoidable circumstances, they should enter the classroom with the permission of the teacher; and without disturbing the class will sit down on benches, which are reserved for latecomers.
- 12.** Students will be permitted to interact with the administrative office for any type of work including payment of fees etc only during scheduled time displayed at the counters/outside the office.
- 13.** Students shall take prior permission for remaining absent, even if they have a genuine reason. Disciplinary action will be taken against any student remaining absent for more than 3 (three) continuous working days without permission. In case of sickness or such unexpected reason, the student should

immediately send a note intimating reason for having remained absent, preferably with a certificate from a concerned doctor or intimation from parents/guardian.

14. Students shall not leave the classroom/laboratory during lecture period/practical without permission of the concerned faculty.

15. Students are allowed to use library, common room, gymkhana and canteen during their schedule time and only in free time; and not during lectures/practicals.

16. Cent percent (100%) attendance in Lectures/Practical's/Tutorials is compulsory. Those remaining absent with prior permission for genuine reasons should also have at least 75% attendance in each subject. Otherwise, as per University rules their term will not be granted and he/she will not be permitted to appear in the University examination. Any excuse will not be accepted at the end of the term, if the attendance falls short.

17. For granting term, students are required to submit the journals/assignments on time and appear in compulsory periodic tests.

18. Use of unfair means during examination will be punishable as per University of Mumbai rules.

19. In addition to the above, students shall follow rules and procedure specified for examination, use of library, laboratory, canteen and Gymkhana. Relevant rules and regulations are available at respective centers or displayed from time to time.

Prevention of Ragging in Technical Institutions

Ragging in any form in the college is prohibited and strict action according to rules shall be taken against those candidates who indulge in it.

Ragging is prohibited as per the decision of the Supreme Court of India in Writ Petition No. (C) 656/1998.

Dress code*

Normally, students are supposed to wear following types of dresses:

Boys: Pants/formal jeans, Shirt/ T-Shirt with sleeves, (Shorts are not allowed).

Girls: Saree (blouse with sleeves), Salwar-Kameez with sleeves, Trousers/full formal jeans (no tights, hipsters or low waist), Shirts/T-Shirts with sleeves (should not be body hugging).

General:

1. Specific dress code for sensitive areas or laboratories shall be applicable.
2. In specific cases, dresses other than the above may be permitted.
3. Slippers are not permitted.
4. Boys (other than Sikhs) to have normal hair cut (long hair and odd looking hair cut will not be permitted). Sikh students shall wear turbans.
5. Girls shall keep hair properly tied/buckled

Important note:

If anyone is found in attire which violates the decorum and/or is found objectionable, appropriate disciplinary action shall be taken by the college authorities.
